We are growing stronger every year and have attained the distinguishing acknowledgement as the conduit for FMD information throughout the world. We are the group that brings together the top minds in the world working towards understanding Fibromuscular Dysplasia, and then disseminates that information to the public. Our awareness campaigns have really started to explode and the following years should bring even more enlightenment. We thank everyone that has been a part of our growth and success and look forward to an even greater 2016.
